The Gate of the Year

Here we are, at the start of 2023. The Christmas lights are coming down and the festivities are turning back to a more regular pattern of life. Walking through the doorway of the new year can be a time of mixed emotions. Looking forward to new things whilst reflecting on what has come before. Depending on our individual situation, we may be looking at the future and the coming year with hope or anxiety. The new year is a time of resolutions and reminding ourselves of our priorities. The new year can also be a time of uncertainty, when we don't know exactly what the coming months will bring us.

That feeling of uncertainty and trepidation coming into the new year, is reflected in the famous poem 'The Gate of the Year' by Minnie Louise Haskins:

"I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year:

'Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown'"

This year perhaps even more than many years, many of us may be hoping for a bit of light to guide us as we move forwards. Hoping for a good year ahead but maybe feeling a bit tentative about the next steps.

In the poem, the man at the gate of the year encourages the poet to put her hand into God's for safe guidance through the way ahead. The poet does this and steps confidently out into the darkness. I find this really powerful as an image, because there is not any particular indication that only good things will happen once we have entrusted our way to God. There are no guarantees that everything will be perfect or work out as we would want. The only guarantee is that we have a trusted guide who can bring us through the challenges on the best possible path. Who will fall with us when we stumble and help us to get up again. 

The acquisition of Strawberry Hill, a unique Bedfordshire farm, is set to unlock a wealth of amazing future opportunities, thanks to generous funding

The purchase of a Bedfordshire farm which has been left to rewild for 25 years is one of the most exciting land acquisitions in our Trust's history. Surrounded by arable farmland, the 150 -hectare **Strawberry Hill at Knotting Green, Bedfordshire**, is a unique opportunity to save a site rich in nature and create a wild visitor destination.

In the 1990s an enlightened farmer gave up sowing crops and turned his land over to nature - Strawberry Hill has now been transformed from arable fields to the largest area of scrub and young woodland in the region.

A bird survey has shown healthy populations of nightingales, willow warblers, whitethroats and garden warblers with habitat ideal for turtle doves.

In order to give the Trust time to raise the funds to purchase the freehold of the site, we are hugely grateful that it has initially been bought by the Esmee Fairbairn Foundation and Julia Davies, founder of 'We Have the POWER' with help from some generous philanthropic lenders through her Funding Nature Project.




