The Experience of Easter

When I was a child, the first hymn at the Easter Sunday service was always "Jesus Christ is Risen Today." Each year it was the word "today" that caught my attention. Something very important was happening today. Now, years later, I can talk about the Resurrection in adult language (and even use long words!) Essentially, though, my experience on Easter Sunday is still simple: I see a world bathed in light as the sun rises and the darkness disappears. A miracle has taken place.

As a child, in the weeks leading up to Easter I collected frog spawn from the pond and started to watch a miracle unfolding before my eyes, as the eggs became tadpoles and then frogs. I would take the frogs back to the pond and the cycle would be repeated. (This continued until a friend of mine suggested that it was better to leave the spawn in the pond!) Today as an adult I experience other miracles as the snowdrops appear by the river and the primroses on the verges. I see the new-born lambs gambolling in the fields.

As teenagers and then as adults we are taught to explain things. Our miraculous experiences, whether at the Easter Service or in the countryside, are explained rationally. However, are we not in danger of making what philosophers might call a category mistake? There is, after all, a world of difference between experience and explanation. A couple who are in love are experiencing a sublime emotional attachment. They are not explaining it. For them, their feelings for each other really are miraculous. As Thomas Hardy wrote: Yonder a maid and her wight

Come whispering by:

War's annal will cloud into night

Ere their story die.

Easter, it seems to me, is to do with experience rather than explanation. It is a time to experience rebirth and resurrection, both at church and in the world around us. It is a time when the dark clouds give way to sunshine; a time when hope enters our hearts and our dark world surrenders to light.




