Dear Friends

Have you ever got into trouble while abroad? The story is told of a group of tourists who went to Israel and arrived in Jerusalem to see the sites of the old city. Four members of the group were so engrossed in taking pictures of each other by the Wailing Wall that they ignored the summons from the tour group leader to go back to the bus. A little while later, they realised that they were all on their own in Jerusalem. That's when their problems started.

The four tourists decided to head back to their hotel. But no one could remember the exact name of the hotel. So they hailed a taxi, and asked it to drive around Jerusalem looking for the hotel. An hour or so later, the driver gave up and demanded payment. That's when they discovered that they did not have enough money to pay the driver. So the driver took them to the police, who demanded some identification. That's when the four tourists remembered that they had left their passports in the hotel safe...

Some hours later, the tour guide tracked down the missing tourists. They greeted her with tears of relief as she provided the police with their passports, paid their debt, and prepared to lead them safely back to their hotel. The police warned the tourists: "From now on, you stay close to your friend!"

Stay close to your friend. It's good advice for all of us. If your life is going in the wrong direction, if you have run up debts of wrongdoing, if you feel lost and alone, you need to take action. You need to stop going on like this. Turn around, and go in another direction.

The Bible calls this action of 'stopping and turning around' repentance.

Repentance is when you stop, and you turn to God. For the good news is that there is a heavenly tour guide on whom we can all call. Only God can save us from the mess we are in. He sent us his Son to forgive us our sins, to provide us with an identity, and, if we walk with him, lead us safely through life.

As the Bible says: “The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.” (Romans 6:23).

## BEDFORDSHIRE WALKING FESTIVAL 2012

The fourth Bedfordshire Walking Festival takes place over 9 days from 6<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup> September, with walks to suit almost all abilities. The 70 walks organised by The Ramblers Bedfordshire Area and supported by National Trust, Bedford Milton Keynes Waterway Trust, Long Distant walkers Association, Marston Vale Trust, Bedford Borough and Central Bedfordshire Countryside departments, range from short health walks of up to an hour in duration to three to five mile ambles and interest/information walks to half day walks of between 5.5 and 7.5 miles to full day walks ranging from 9 to 15 miles to the real challenge of 40 miles over two days. All the walks are free.

Those with a sense of history are not forgotten, the two mills informative walk from Bromham Mill will see the magnificent sight of the sails flying on Stevington Windmill (with weather permitting) and a Bunyan walk from his city of destruction via his birthplace to his celestial city.

For some the highlight of the 9 day festival is on the last weekend with the RU4 THE CHALLENGE a two day walk along the 40 miles of the Greensand Ridge. Every year the challenge has increased in popularity and people wishing to either join the led walk or run/walk/jog, need to register. Participants can sign up for both days or just one day and we welcome anyone wishing to raise money for a charity of their choice. There is a £10 charge to cover organisational and transport costs.

## DEFICIT AND DEBT

Over the last few years much has been made of our country's deficit and debt and it may be that some of us are not completely aware of the difference. However, as I write this I am becoming very aware of the difference because over the last few years St Mary's church has been running with an annual deficit and within the next couple of years we will be in debt.

Let me explain in more detail. At the end of the 2011 financial year the General Fund stood at £3,500 in credit, this year we forecast that there will be a deficit of £1,500, this means that by the end of 2012 the General Fund will only be £2,000 in credit. If this trend continues, the General Fund will be in debt by the middle of 2014.

When a country is in debt the government can issue bonds, increase taxes or print more money, unfortunately these "financial instruments" are not available to us at St Mary's. However, what we can do is to ask parishioners if they could please contribute, on a regular basis, to the General Fund thus keeping us out of debt.



It costs approximately £400 a week to keep St Mary's church open and this translates into 100 people giving £4 a week, every week! Four pounds a week may sound a lot to ask but it's only the price of a pint and a half of beer, 10 cigarettes, or two tall lattes at Starbucks! Please could you seriously consider giving a regular weekly or monthly contribution to help keep St Mary's church open?

## DID YOU KNOW?

- During the occupation of these Islands, the Romans created a Goddess called *Britannia* to represent the Province. She was shown sitting on a rock, wearing a helmet and holding a spear. *Britannia* is still used as a symbol of our islands today.
- The Roman God of Fire was *Vulcan*, often shown with a blacksmith's hammer in his hand.
