### **Poppy Appeal 2006**

### **Playing Field Hedge**

The playing field hedge is having a rather drastic haircut. This is a condition of the new lease. The Countryside Ranger from Harrod Country Park is overseeing the job. Any native trees will be left - properly tidied - as specimens along the hedge. A new gate will be fitted in due course.  
By cutting and thinning the hedge it will in a short time thicken up and form a safe barrier around the field.

### **Organ Restoration**

Nicholson & Co are starting work restoring the church organ on 8th January 2007. They will dismantle the organ and take items requiring attention to their factory in Malvern before re-assembling probably during March. It is hoped work will be completed before Easter. Nicholsons will hold an open day before the re-assembly so parishioners and others interested in organs can see the innards of such a large musical instrument.

A small exhibition is currently in church showing the heritage of the organ including how money was raised in the 1870s to buy the organ, copies of local press reports and the background of the organ builder John Nicholson. During the restoration a small electronic organ will be used during services.
