### Advent and Christmas

We are now in the season of Advent, the time when Christians prepare themselves for the coming of Jesus, not only remembering the time when he came to earth on the first Christmas, but also looking forward when he will come again. Traditionally Advent was a season of fasting and penitence, a time for self examination so that those who follow Jesus would be ready for the time when he would come again to establish the kingdom of God on this earth. John the Baptist gave the message to 'repent for the kingdom of God is at hand' to those who came to hear him as he sought to prepare them for the coming of Jesus. This message is as valid for us today as it was for those who heard him speaking while he was alive. Let us spend some time in prayer and study; looking at our own lives in the light of the gospel message, making changes in them where they are not in accord with that message, and renewing our relationship with God. Let us make ourselves ready not only to rejoice and give thanks for God's gift to his people all those years ago, but also to be ready to receive him when he comes in glory at God's appointed time. I wish you all a very fulfilling Advent, and a Joyous Christmas.
