### A Cloud of Witnesses

It is the season of the year when we celebrate the various Patronal Festivals in the different churches of the Benefice. Souldrop (All Saints) had their service in May, Sharnbrook (St Peter) in June, and our own in September (St Mary). We do not hear so much about the Saints and their special days as we used to when I was young, and I believe that this is a pity. It was interesting as a child to discover about the life, works, and sometimes the grizzly facts around the death of the saint to which the church that we attended was dedicated. As we learned more about our faith we discovered how those faithful disciples since the time of Jesus had striven to take the Gospel out into the world, and of how many of them had undergone persecution, even martyrdom, so that others could learn about Jesus and the gospel that he proclaimed. The way that they taught about and lived the gospel life was given to us as an example to be followed in our own lives.

As we continue on our journey of faith and discovery we come to learn about the work of the great cloud of witnesses to the faith, most of them unknown to us as individuals, who through their witness to the faith in the words that they have spoken, and the way in which their lives bear ring true to the faith that they profess, have inspired others to seek Jesus and to acknowledge him as Lord. Often those who have been inspirational in this way would have been unaware of the influence that they have had in bringing others to the faith. Sometimes the inspiration that they gave only bore fruit many years later. It can be compared to sowing seeds, the seed is sown, sometimes it takes a long time to germinate, even years, so that the sower never sees the result of his (or her) labours.

Here is an important example to all of us who have accepted Jesus as Lord. We are all called to be disciples. Some will have the gifts of teaching and preaching, but the absence of those gifts does not absolve us from the tasks of discipleship. We must remember that the most effective witness to our faith is the way in which it affects the way that we live. The early Christians were known by those among communities in which they lived as those who loved the people among whom they dwelt. The importance of the faith to us, and the way in which affects our lives will speak more to those around us than the words that we say. We may never know the inspiration that we may have been for good or ill. Let us pray for wisdom and guidance for the way that we speak and the way that we live our lives, and above all, for the love of God and the strength of our faith to shine out through us and make us true disciples of our Lord.

### **Blossoming Knowledge**

The Felmersham and Radwell P3 group would like to say a very big thank you to Laurie Jones, lifelong botanist and Felmersham resident, for guiding an enthusiastic group of around a dozen villagers around the botanical wonders of Harrold Odell Country Park on Saturday 14th June.

On this occasion the emphasis was much more on the natural history than the walking and within a few metres of setting off, the group had eagerly ticked around 10 plant species on their checklist. Laurie opened our eyes to the beauty of many of the common plants that we tend to walk past without noticing, but which are well worth closer inspection.

Some of the botanical highlights of the morning were the pretty campions, cranesbills and speedwell and the three orchid species: the bee orchid; common spotted; and the rarer (and much harder to spot!) twayblade. A total of nearly 40 species were ticked off our list over the course of the walk.

After a fascinating couple of hours, the group retired to the cafe for a well earned cuppa and all agreed that they'd learned a huge amount and were inspired to continue plant spotting in the future. (Photos will be on Felmersham.net)

### **The Gobi March: Update**

Use News has previously reported that Christian Coghlan and his friend, Adam Kamyar, were about to take part in the Gobi March 2008 on June 8th, to raise money for Macmillan Cancer Support. This six stage race took place in extreme temperatures and across some very difficult terrain, sometimes at very high altitude. The host city was Kashgar in the extreme west of China, near to the Kyrgyzstan border and the race crossed areas not visited by Europeans before.

Unfortunately, due to a serious leg injury sustained before the race, Adam was unable to take part. However, Christian completed this gruelling 155 mile race in 42 hours, three minutes and 48 seconds, coming in 52nd out of 144 successful competitors from around the world. ### **Harrold Odell Country Park Events**

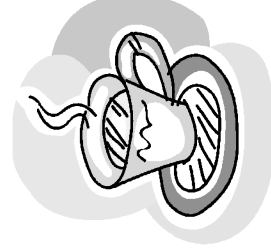
