We are now at that time in the Church's year when we move from a more active program that began with Advent and culminating in Pentecost to the more reflective time of the series of Sundays after Trinity. In our country we have just had the excitement of a General Election and we now face a period of coalition government which will be a new experience for most of us. It is exciting and challenging to live in eventful and changing times, it can be a time when new ideas and ways of dealing with old problems may emerge as well as the new problems and solutions which are inevitable in new situations.

It seems to me that in our spiritual life as well as in our secular one we need times of stimulation and challenge as well as ones of reflection and study. A life which is all go and action, and which allows no time for rest and reflection runs the risk of 'burnout' and breakdown. A life which is no-go and no-action runs the risk of staleness and permanent lethargy. There has to be a balance if we are to get the most out of the gift of life that we have been given. Our faith has to be worked at through study, prayer and practice, if it is not worked at it is in great danger of dying. I believe that the same principles apply to many other active aspects of life. So often we fail to follow these principles as we become involved in so many things that we do not allow ourselves to spend enough time to think deeply about any of them. This is particularly important in our faith and in our relationships. Too often marriages fail because the partners stop working at maintaining love for each other, which is the foundation of the relationship, because of their jobs or other activities.

We live in stimulating and challenging times, and although such times can be unsettling they can also be exciting and make us think of new directions and opportunities. But let us not forget to take time out for reflection and the maintenance of those things in our life that are precious to us. Let us not forget the importance of our faith and of our deep relationships and that we need both to work at them and to spend time of reflection on them so that they are strengthened and deepened. Let us all remember that we also need times of rest, time to relax and release the pressure of life, time to enjoy the gift of life which we have been so generously given

Harold Volunteer Drivers

This service has been set up by Wellingborough Volunteer Bureau in conjunction with Harold Medical Practice with the help of funding provided by the Friends of Harold Surgery. It is on the verge of folding due to the lack of local volunteer drivers, leaving those patients who have come to rely on it to try and make alternative arrangements.

This service takes people, mainly elderly or disabled, to essential medical appointments. It is for people without their own transport and where there is no public transport available. The service picks users up at home, takes them to their medical appointment, waits with them and returns them safely home. Drivers are volunteers who use their own cars. Petrol expenses are covered by the passenger. 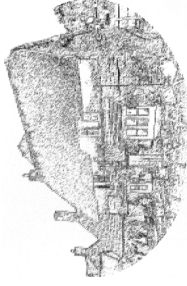
