Lent and Easter Rev David G Mason

This year Easter is almost as late as it can be according to the tables used to fix the date of this Festival. Unless spring is late in coming there may not be so many spring flowers to decorate the Church for Easter as I suspect many of them will have passed their best. Hopefully we will be enjoying the warmer weather that it usually associated with late spring. The nights will be shorter and the crops in the fields should be growing and developing well.

This year there will be a Lent Course in the Parish to follow the Bishop of St Alban's Lent Course (see below). This course is part of the new diocesan initiative 'Living God's Love'. 'This is an invitation to the people, parishes and deaneries to explore what it means to live by God's love today by seeking to go deeper into God, to transform communities and to make new disciples. It is an invitation to journey, to see things from new perspectives, to discover new ways of doing things and to learn from each other as we travel together.

There are many ways in which we can explore that journey. Individuals and groups can take time to pray, reflect, study and discuss what it might mean in their lives, their homes and their work. *Living God's Love* is an invitation to a deeper and more radical discipleship. Initiatives will be developed, for example in Lent and Advent, to help parishes and people explore that invitation and strengthen their discipleship.' Each parish will be invited to ask how its own mission and ministry can be developed and shaped to live God's love more effectively, more faithfully and more joyfully in the light of the three themes that are to be explored. The published material looks good, and I am sure that the course will be challenging and exciting. It will certainly make us think and possibly re-evaluate our faith and how we are living it. I commend the course to you.

W.I. May Mills

Most of us know of William Morris the designer of wallpaper and fabric, but what of William Morris the man? Helen Elletson took us through his life story, entirely without the use of notes, and using only the occasional slide.

He was educated at Oxford where he met Edward Burne-Jones and afterwards the group of artists known as the Pre-Raphaelites. He studied architecture but was persuaded by Rossetti to become an artist, and married one of Rossetti's models, Jane Burden, an illiterate, Pre-Raphaelite beauty.

He was at the forefront of the Arts and Crafts Movement when he founded his firm to carry out the artistic concepts of his friends in the design and manufacture of furniture, wallpaper, textiles and stained glass. He established himself as a major Romantic poet and as a translator of Icelandic prose and verse.

He founded the Society for the Preservation of Ancient Buildings and the Kelmscott Press. He insisted that you should have nothing in your home that is not useful or beautiful. Helen did not delve into his political career as a radical Socialist, but only had time to give us the shell of this remarkable man.

Abridged minutes of the meeting held on1st March

The Chairman, Peter Hartop, reminded us that this Parish Council will end with the election on the 5th May. He expressed frustration that many things discussed at the same meeting last year were still outstanding. In particular he mentioned road sweeping, gulley/drain clearing, overgrown hedges, the heavily eroded slipway and broken culvert next to the Jubilee Lawn and a disappointing lack of action from the Borough Enforcement Officer.

Peter concluded by thanking the Clerk and fellow Parish Councillors for their help and support over the year. We also heard reports from the Clerk (Financial report), P3 (Parish Paths Partnership) and the Village Hall Committee.

Comments from the floor were made on: the state of the verges, mud left on the road; red and white boards by Dropshort, village "gates" and speeding

Highways - a large pothole by Harrowdene Farmhouse had been repaired but another had now appeared. A request had been made for the drains be cleared and the roads swept. The Director of Environment had written addressing the many issues raised by this Council. Parking tickets had been issued to vehicles parked near the school.

Planning - a representative of Britannia Parks advised the Council on their plans for The Retreat at Radwell.
