### The Organ Restored

It was good to hear the organ again on Easter Sunday, now fully restored and working well. The work was carried out by Nicholson's, the firm that originally installed the organ, and we are all pleased with the result of their labours, and the way in which they performed the work. Much effort went into the project, and on your behalf I would like to thank all those who were involved in any way. We are indeed fortunate to have among us those with the skill and patience to raise the funds to finance the work, and to organise the work. We are also grateful for the gift of the instrument that was used while the organ was being worked on.

The organ restoration just completed was an example of stewardship; many people were involved, using the different talents that they had to enable the work to be completed. There is a tendency to regard the use of the word 'stewardship' in connection with the church as an excuse to demand more money from the congregation, and many are suspicious of stewardship schemes because of this. But the original concept of Stewardship in the church was to develop the use of the many talents that are present in congregations to meet the needs of the church and to develop its work among the people. It is unfortunate that the use of the word 'stewardship' in connection with the church has become so tied in with the provision of finance because it ought to be recognised that this is only one aspect. Stewardship should be recognised as an essential part of the discipleship to which we are all called. God has given each one of us gifts that can be used in his service. It is true that money is important, but so are the talents that God has given each one of us. The church community should work to help its members to recognise, develop and use the gifts that God has given to each one of them. The way that the organ restoration was enabled, funded and undertaken is a good example of effective stewardship in action.

Once again many thanks to all who enabled the work to be undertaken, and many thanks to all who do so much for the church in so many different ways. And let us all thank God for all the wonderful gifts that he has given to us, and let us ask him how to use them in his service.

### **Margaret Alleway Memorial Garden**

This month I can report that the grass has had its first cut but it still needs lots more work before we can achieve a flat, smooth lawn. Additional fencing has been erected between the Memorial Garden and the slipway, although a few more mature hedging trees will soon be planted to complete the boundary. The Trust is still awaiting permission from the Planning Department at the Borough Council, to pollard seven of the unsightly willow trees and remove deadwood and improve three other trees, especially those with road overhang. As soon as permission is forthcoming we have a tree surgeon lined up to start work, hopefully at the beginning of May. At this point we may be asking our working party to assemble!
