### Review of the Year

Last Sunday (20<sup>th</sup> April) the Archdeacon visited us for our Sunday Service to preach and dedicate the restored organ, the recently completed quilted items and wooden case, and some altar linen. It was good to share our celebrations with the other churches in the benefice. On the Monday after we held our Annual Parish Church meeting, a time for reviewing the previous year, for considering our present situation, and for looking forward to the coming year.

I believe that the relationship between the different churches in the benefice is good and developing well. The regular sharing of services in different churches is helping us to get to know and appreciate each other. There is much scope for further developments within the benefice, for example we look forward to developing new patterns of service for families and young people. This cooperation will be even more important in the future as fewer ordained clergy will be available, and an increased involvement of church members in leading and supporting worship and ministry will be necessary if regular worship and ministry is to continue in the parishes.

As we celebrated all the work that was done in the church or provided for it we were reminded of the great support for our church that is provided by its members and from the parish. So many people are involved in so many different ways, and I thank you all for the care and support that you continue to give. A glance at the comments in the visitors book shows how much the care and maintenance of the church is appreciated by visitors, and I have been told by strangers who visit the church for services how welcoming they find the members of the church are. The early members of the church were admired by the people among whom they lived as those who loved their neighbours, and it is important for the future of the church that it continues to follow this Christian principle.

Within the Deanery we are exploring ways of providing the training for those who are becoming more involved in the local ministry of the church. We appreciate that, particularly for some parts of the Deanery, and for some people's pattern of work, regular attendance at courses in Bedford may not be possible. I hope that we will be able to meet the need for training in ways that make it more possible for those called to some aspect of ministry to be encouraged, supported and trained. Do not think that because of limitations of time or problems with travel you are unable to volunteer to help in some way with ministry, ask and trust that a way will be found.

The organ in Church was fully restored in 2007 and to commemorate this event a beautiful quilt was made by the ladies of Ouse Valley Quilters. This quilt is now on permanent display in the Church in a very fine case, which was donated by Dick Horsford in memory of his wife and son.

Also an exquisite altar cover was made by Di Stephenson and Pat Keeble. The idea of the altar cover came from a cope, a sort of cape worn on special occasions by priests, which was shown to the congregation during a service a couple of years ago. The cope, like the altar cover, is richly embroidered and decorated. Di Stephenson came up from Cornwall especially for the service.

## Felmersham and Radwell Community Trust (FRCT)

The late Margaret Alleway made a bequest to Felmersham and Radwell Community Care, "for their general purposes", to the value of approximately £230,000. In February 2004 the "*Felmersham and Radwell Community Trust*" was formed and registered as a charity - the trustees are Michael Thomas, Jeff Stokley, Richard Phipps and Lorraine Shrimpton.

Since the FRCT was formed, funding has been granted to several village organisations, plus the purchase of river frontage land to make the "*Margaret Alleway Memorial Garden*".
