The members of the church bring and use their many different gifts and talents to support, strengthen and develop the community of the faithful and also the wider community among whom they live. The community of the early church were known for the love that the members showed to each other and to the people among whom they lived. It is good that our church building is maintained and developed so well and so lovingly to be a resource for the whole community as well as for the worshipping community that is the church in Felmersham. It is also good that the members of our church community are so involved in the life of the village, continuing the tradition of service to the community that has featured in Christian discipleship through the ages since the time of our Lord.

We live in times when the Christian faith is being challenged and ridiculed by some who seem to wish to continue the work of those through the centuries have sought to deny the faith. It is important that those around us can see that our faith is strong and that it shines out in our lives just as it did for the first members of the Christian community all those years ago when many came to the faith through observing the way in which the lives of those who believed were changed for the good through their acceptance of Jesus as Lord.
