Dear Friends,

I write this, shortly after sharing in the most wonderful Easter and Lent services, with full churches and being led in joyful worship by the choir. We responded enthusiastically to the proclamation "Christ is Risen, Alleluia!" with the words "He is risen indeed, Alleluia!"

Easter is the bedrock of our belief. We believe that Christ died for us, was buried, but rose again. This month, on May 9<sup>th</sup>, the church celebrates the Ascension when Christ was parted visibly from his disciples, and took His rightful place in heaven. He left the instructions that they should stay in Jerusalem until they received the power that he had promised. Accordingly, the disciples stayed together, meeting for prayer and supporting one another, until that wonderful day of Pentecost, which we celebrate on Sunday May 19<sup>th</sup>. This day, we celebrate as the birthday of the church. As the disciples joined in prayer, they experienced what they described as the sound of a rushing, mighty wind, and they seemed to see tongues of fire hovering over their heads. Whatever it was that they experienced, the one thing they were certain of, and that was that they had been filled with a new boldness and a desire to share with others, the good news of Jesus' victory over death.

Their task was to make new disciples who were willing to commit their lives to sharing with others the Good News, whatever the cost to themselves.

Jesus was no longer present in the flesh, but each believer had the task of being "his hands and feet and voice" reaching out with love and compassion to the poor and needy, making a stand for justice, and condemning unfair practices. Jesus promised that His Spirit would be given to every believer, and we continue to claim that promise today.

The church has survived 2,000 years, but is increasingly under attack from atheists and secularist activists. We again need to ask for the Holy Spirit to give us courage to stand up for what we believe in. Many Christians in other countries face harassment and persecution from fundamentalists of other religions.

Be thankful for the freedoms we so often take for granted and if you say that you are a Christian – be proud of the fact. Pray for courage to stand up for what you truly believe in. Join with us in Worship and ask God what you can do, to be an effective witness for Him, in order that the Church may continue to survive.




