Soon we will be celebrating the Church's New Year as we move into the season of Advent. This was the time when traditionally, a new year was begun as the members of the Church looked forward to the coming of Jesus as a baby, and began a period of preparation to be ready for his coming. The time of Advent is known as a penitential season, a time for examination of the life being lived in the light of the way of life taught by Jesus during his time on earth as the way God wanted all people to follow. Let us pray for those in authority that they will be filled with compassion for those in desperate need as they work to resolve the country's difficulties.

Minor changes to bus times from 24th October

On **Mondays to Saturdays** the former 18.40 departure from Bedford has shifted to 18.50 and there is an **additional evening bus** leaving the bus station at 19.50. Both of these call at the railway station to connect out of the 18.00 and 19.00 trains from St Pancras. In the other direction the 20.06 from Felmersham to Bedford no longer runs (but the 20.22 remains).

Saturdays: the former 07.52 to Bedford moves to 07.47 to match weekdays.

Sundays: the former first bus from Bedford (09.00) and the last bus to Bedford (20.12) no longer run. The remainder of the Sunday southbound services run 15 minutes later than previously, now at 10.27 and two hourly to 18.27.
