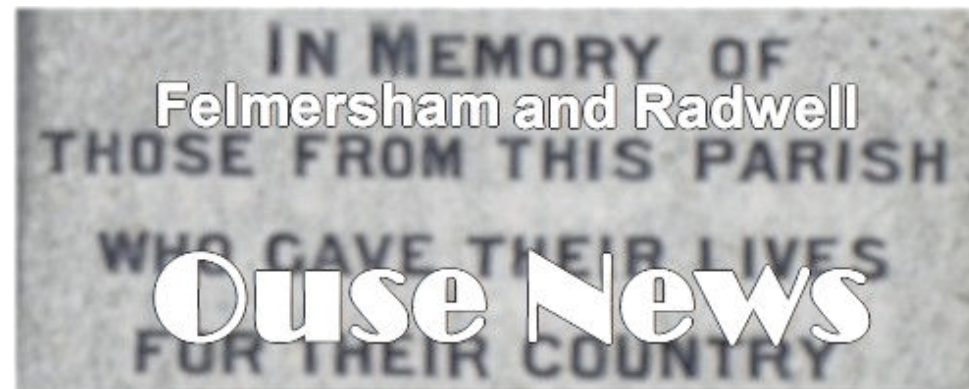

CHANGE

Fr. Tom

And so it seems we have finally turned a corner in our weather. The long and wonderful summer of 2013 has drawn to a close and everything has become decidedly more autumnal. In a fashion typical to the English, we find ourselves saying in polite conversation '*well, we can't complain.*' Indeed, we can't complain, the change did have to come sooner or later.

The whole idea of change (and I'm not talking about the weather) does however do interesting things in the minds of people. When faced with change some bewail and seek anchorage in the annals of past tradition, others cast off such fetters and grasp the new opportunity with optimism and intrigue and some remain pensive and reserved in the middle. My default position is probably the latter, I recognize the need to change, but am occasionally reluctant to embrace it, especially if I think it is without good reason. Which one are you I wonder? Do you seek refuge in tradition and the past or do you look to the future, to the innovative and exciting opportunities of tomorrow or are you somewhere in the middle?

Where is the church in all this? As I understand it, the church is or *should be* a place of change, of turning things around. In trying to follow Christ's steps we (in the church) should be seeking to make the changes he did; hate to love, strife to peace, mourning to joy, death to life, sin to grace. This should be our life-giving task – bringing everyone together (which incidentally doesn't mean we all look and sound the same) to share joyfully in the gift of life and its very author.

Quite often however I find that the church falls desperately short of this call, remaining laboriously bound to the traditions of yesteryear, and for this I'm sorry. I'm sorry because 1) it means that we become exclusive to those who have lived in the past and, 2) because this attitude marginalizes the possibility of a future in which we have any wide spread relevance.

The life and message of Jesus Christ, which is interestingly often missing from calls to embrace the traditions of the past, is what we need to hold at the center of the churches mission and purpose. '*Seek first the Kingdom of God.*' The Gospel is as relevant today as it ever was. There is greed and corruption and hatred and scandal and injustice a plenty in Britain 2013, and despite the best efforts of secular moralists to persuade us otherwise, our Lord does indeed have something to say in response to all of this. But how are we to hear him?

If the church is to survive, or even to speak in tones relevant to a majority in the future, it must be prepared to speak its message afresh, not clinging to what worked in the past, but looking to the here and now to find a voice. A season of change is upon us. Someone once said that 'tradition should be the living faith of dead people, NOT the dead faith of living people'. So what are we in the church, what are you in your faith, dead or alive?!

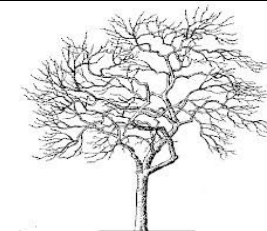

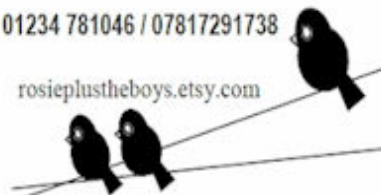
