Some of you may know that, in January, we joined a small group visiting the two homes in Andhra Pradesh which are run by CHIT (Children's Homes in India Trust). We stayed at the Bapatia home, and had a wonderful time meeting the staff, and playing, working and talking with the children. We came away with a much clearer idea of their needs, and we were quite overwhelmed by their gratitude to all the UK sponsors and supporters. There are 11 million abandoned children in India and even the smallest child in the home was aware of their own good fortune. We, in our turn, were very impressed at the loving care with which these children are nurtured, and very aware of their need to do what we can.

We were also impressed at the importance the children themselves attach to education. However, the school has very little indeed in the way of resources and is desperate for money to purchase basic equipment - perhaps this could be our next focus, now that the boys have their new toilets. (In addition, the children will soon have a special room to go when they are unwell. Thanks to you all for your contributions to those projects.)
