



Without April showers of any note (where have they gone?), and record temperatures for the end of April and start of May, the park is quite dry. This is quite a remarkable thing to say after having been flooded many times over the autumn and winter!

Regular readers of this article will know that we are looking at all the work

we need to do to retain the Green Flag Award for another year — so we have been fixing benches, cleaning signage, painting and treating wooden structures amongst a lot of other things.

Of course, the grass and vegetation has started growing well and we are busy cutting back the overhangs and keeping the amenity areas cut but leaving areas for wildflowers too. We are also busy at this time of year with school visits and educating a new generation of youngsters in the kind of bugs that can be found in the park or what



can be found in the lakes with our pond dipping sessions — anything from pond snails and dragonfly larvae to water scorpions as well as the occasional water measurer or bullhead fish! Our park is very diverse, and we celebrate that sometimes through the sculptures that you might find around the park. Recently, we installed a new otter sculpture to be seen in the water from the duck feeding area — you'll have to visit if you want to know what it looks like!

Opening times for the Dragonfly Café are 9am to 4pm, seven days a week. Well behaved dogs are also welcome with doggy biscuits or a puppucino on the treat menu for your pampered pooch!

Every other Thursday, there are health walks around the park and/or local area. Meeting at 10:30am at the woodland entrance to the Dragonfly Café, they last about 1 hour. ANNUAL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING: 14 MAY 2025 EDITED HIGHLIGHTS

Peter Hartop was re-elected as Chairman and Marjorie Pipe as Vice Chair. Pat Keeble was co-opted to the Council bolstering Radwell representation following recent resignations.

The Chairman read out a statement from the Parish Council regarding the Major Retrospective Planning Permission Application for land at the East side of Pavenham Road, Felmersham. A report in the form of a comprehensive objection letter commissioned from an experienced planning expert was unanimously endorsed by the Parish Council as the council's statutory response to be forwarded to Bedford Borough Planning Department. The Parish Council also approved a certain level of emergency expenditure to be available for further expert advice when required.

Ground works to improve the landscaping around the War Memorial were approved by the Parish Council.

The Parish Council requested that 2 "Entrance Gates" on the Felmersham to Radwell road are repainted to match the new replacement gate destroyed in a car accident last year.

The Parish Council acknowledged and thanked Neil Smith from Radwell for planting oak trees on the Felmersham to Radwell Road and undertaking "crown raising" on several of the more mature trees along the same road.

On Saturday 16 August the annual rural Bulky Waste Collection Service will be on Radwell Green between 8:00 and 10:00am and at the entrance to Marriotts Close in Felmersham from 10:30 to 12:00noon.

The proposed meeting dates for 2025/2026 are 9 July, 10 Sept, 12 November, 14 January, 11 March, and 13 May 2026 - all Wednesdays. The Annual Parish Meeting closed at 9:20pm.
